

Aprominent bodyguard of Saudi Arabia's King Salman Bin Abdul Aziz has been shot and killed at a friend's house after a personal dispute.

Major General Abdul Aziz Al Fagham's death triggered an outpouring of emotion on Twitter, with some condemning the killing of the Saudi ruler's "guardian angel".

Al Fagham died on Saturday evening in Jeddah. A spokesman said that the gunman was shot dead by security forces, but that five officers were wounded in the melee that has shocked the kingdom.

Young woman, two technicians receive 70 per cent burns

A deadly gas explosion in a Dubai residential building on Saturday claimed the life of one resident and injured three others, Dubai Police said.

Colonel Faisal Al Qasim, Director of Security Media department at Dubai Police, said four people were injured in the incident and transferred to Rashid hospital

where one of them died. "A gas leak explosion took place in a flat in the Al Mankhool area in Dubai on Saturday night. Police patrols and Civil Defence rushed to the scene. One person was killed and three others sustained seri-ous injuries."

The injured, who suffered 70 per cent burns, include one young woman, the tenant of the studio apartment where the explosion occurred, and two gas technicians who were

two gas technicians who were called in to fix the problem. The building with 100-plus apartments was evacu-ated following the explosion. Residents of the cordoned-off building have been moved to a neighbouring hotel apart-ment.
